- An applicant may apply for an extension in extreme circumstances (death of family member, illness) leading up to the due date. The maximum time for an extension will be two weeks, and extensions won't be granted for general lateness.
- Any work submitted after the above dates without an extension will not be assessed for 2018, but will be carried over to the following year. It is helpful to aim to complete the relevant requirement at least two weeks beforehand.
- Applicants attending the drill and interview assessment day in August need to be there for the whole afternoon to assist with the assessment of other applicants.



REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to receive your King's Badge you must be at least BB Age 16* and fulfil all three of the following requirements.

1

Badges

Certain badges must be obtained

2

Leadership Courses

3 weekend leadership courses or 1 week long leadership course must be passed

3

Captain's Endorsement

Your Captain must be satisfied that you are a good ambassador for BB and have made a positive impact.

After you have met all these requirements, your captain needs to submit the 'King's Badge Application Form' to the BBV KB Coordinator. This form is available on hub14.

*You must have completed all KB Requirements by the end of the session in which you turned 18. However, at your captain's discretion you can continue working towards your KB until the end of the session in which you turn 19.



CAPTAIN'S ENDORSEMENT

Before a Captain fills out the King's Badge application form (available on hub14), they should be able to answer 'yes' to the following:

- Will the awarding of the King's Badge to this Boy promote the high principles of the Movement in the Company and the community?
- Does he make a significant contribution to the life of the Company or is he merely content to receive?
- Does he have a genuine concern for the other Boys in the Company?
- What is the Boy's general attitude towards honest and other moral values?
- Does he have a sincere sense of loyalty towards his Company, his Church and his Leaders?
- Could you say the intentions of the Object of the Boys' Brigade are displayed in his life and actions?
- Do you feel that his example to the other Boys in private life, are consistent with his example at BB?

In other words, will the awarding of the King's Badge to this Boy enhance the image of the Companies ideals in the eyes of the other Boys?



LEADERSHIP COURSES

BBV runs 3 weekend leadership courses (introductory (red braid), squad (blue braid) and company (green braid) and 2 weeklong leadership courses (team leadership (white braid) and Personal Development (gold braid)).

The weekend courses are usually all run on the same weekend in August. The weeklong courses are usually all run on the same week in the Easter School Holidays.

To be eligible to obtain your KB you must have passed all 3 weekend courses or at least one weeklong courses.

WEEKEND LEADERSHIP COURSES (MUST PASS ALL 3)

- Introductory (**Red** Braid) – min BB Age 14
- Squad (**Blue** Braid) – min BB Age 15
- Company (**Green** Braid) – min BB Age 16

WEEKLONG LEADERSHIP COURSES (ONLY ONE REQUIRED)

- Team Leadership (White Braid) – min BB Age 15
- Personal Development (**Gold** Braid) – min BB Age 16






THE BBK BADGE



To be eligible to obtain your King's Badge you must obtain all 5 levels of the BBK Badge. The first two levels are assessed by your company however levels 3, 4 and 5 are assessed by Boys' Brigade Victoria.

To get levels 3, 4 and 5 you must pass a Drill, Project and Interview Assessment. These can be completed in any order. There are more details about these State Assessments on the following pages.



BBK INTERVIEW

As a part of your BBK Badge you will have to pass an interview. During this interview you will be asked a series of questions by two officers.

Purpose

To confirm your capability to be an ambassador for BB. You should be able to express how your own BB experience reflects how BB attempts to achieve its ideals, and be able to articulate an appropriate considered mature response to a hypothetical situation that could be encountered at BB. It is highly desirable for you to have a good general knowledge of BB and an understanding of the work of BB at an International, National, State, Battalion and Company level.

Pre-requisites

To attempt the BBK Interview you must have completed Level 1 and 2 of the BBK Badge, have obtained your 6mth Service Award and be min BB age 16.

Preparation

You should start preparing for your interview 3 months prior to the assessment. Here are a few tips to help prepare you:

- Watch the video on hub14 about the BBK Interview
- Read through and learn the key information in the BBA Senior's Handbook
- Undertake the Introductory Leadership Course (Red Braid), if possible
- Get some experience by being a Squad Leader or NCO
- Ask your captain or another experienced officer to spend some time with you asking you practice questions

Attending the Interview

You are required to wear an approved BBA Uniform (Classic or Contemporary). You will be assessed on your presentation, so its important to look smart and arrive on time. It is recommended that you check with the BBA Uniform Policy (available on hub14) to make sure that your uniform is correct.



BBK INTERVIEW

Interview Content

In your interview you will be asked questions from the following 5 categories.

Section A: Your Company

Section B: General BB

Section C: Personal Views

Section D: Case Study

Section E: Personal Aspirations

Please note: You must be able to recite the Object of the Boys' Brigade to pass your interview.

BBK DRILL ASSESSMENT

Purpose

To assess your ability to teach accurately and command others taking into account the audience's characteristics.

Pre-requisites

To attempt the BBK Drill Assessment you must be at least BB Age 16 and have obtained your 6mth Service Badge and Level 1 and 2 of the BBK Badge.

Preparation

The best way to prepare for your BBK Drill Assessment is to practice teaching drill in your local company for a number of months. There are also resources available on hub14 to assist in teaching and learning drill maneuvers. In your assessment you will be required to teach any maneuver from the first 6 chapters of the Drill Manual (available on hub14). Also, you will need to take note of any changes made in the Drill Manual Supplement (available on hub14).

Applying to be Assessed

To register your intention to be assessed, please register for the event on the BBVic Rego website or email qbcoordinator@bbvic.com.au

Attending the Drill Assessment

You are required to wear an approved BBA Uniform (Classic or Contemporary). You will be assessed on your presentation, so its important to look smart and arrive on time. It is recommended that you check with the BBA Uniform Policy (available on hub14) to make sure that your uniform is correct.

Before your drill assessment you will be given a card which outline what maneuvers you will be required to teach and to what age of boys you will be teaching. Then you will be given a small amount of time to prepare. The squad that you teach will likely be made up of the other boys going through their assessments. These boys will pretend to be the age which you are instructed to teach. After you have taught 3 commands, you will then be required to command a short sequence of drill maneuvers.

You may bring your Drill Manual into the assessment, although it is not recommended that you refer to it excessively during the assessment. You may also wish to bring other items to assist you.



BBK DRILL ASSESSMENT

Results

The three commands that you are required to teach will be assessed against the following:

Knowledge of the movement

(does he know the details & timing of the movement?)

Commands of the movement

(does he know the correct words of command?)

Presentation of the movement

(how does he teach the movement?)

Execution of the movement

(what is his command of the boys like? eg confidence, timing)

Each command in the short sequence of maneuvers you are required to call will be assessed against the following:

Correct Words of the Command
Correct Timing of the Movement

You will also receive an overall result for your Drill Assessment, which will be one of the following:

Meets Requirements

Requires Additional Training

You may be required to re-take part or all of your Drill Assessment

Requires Extensive Development

You will be required to re-take your Drill Assessment

Your results will be released within 7 days of your drill assessment. Please see Appendix B for a sample results sheet.



BBK PROJECT

Purpose

To present a researched and considered resource on an aspect of The Boys' Brigade that will contribute practically to improving BB at a local or wider level. Your project will possibly be distributed to other Captains for them to use your ideas or resources provided.

Project Format

Your project may take the form of whatever is appropriate for your area of focus. For example, a project researching the effectiveness of different marketing strategies may be produced in the form of an essay. However, a guide on how to be a good squad leader, may be produced as a brochure for boys.

If your project is in a purely written format, then it must total a minimum of 2,000 words. If your project is being produced in another format, then it must be the equivalent effort of 2,000 words.

Process of Completing Your BBK Project

- 1 Submit the 'Project Outline' to the KB Coordinator (see Appendix C)
- 2 Wait for approval from the KB Coordinator before beginning your project.
- 3 After you have received approval, start working on your project
- 4 Submit your project to the KB Coordinator before the last Saturday in August at 11:59pm. Before you submit it is a good idea to get your captain (or another experienced officer) to read through your project.

Assessment

You will be assessed on the following criteria:

1. An appropriate specific issue is identified, understood and addressed
2. Research is evident with all references and acknowledgements made
3. Displays critical individual thinking (own thoughts)
4. Has a sound working understanding of the relevant aspects of BB to the project
5. Logic flow of thoughts
6. Care and attention given to the presentation of your report
7. Follows your approved Table of Contents structure.

CSL3

Purpose

To encourage service to others as a way of life, recognising the call of Jesus to serve others as He did. At Level 3, the service to be undertaken should involve the wider community, the people whom you have had no prior relationship.

Pre-requisites

To commence your Community Service Level 3 you must be at least BB Age 14 and have already obtained level 1 and 2.

Process of Completing Your Community Service Level 3

- 1 Submit the 'Application for Assessment' form (available on hub14) to the KB Coordinator
- 2 Wait for approval from the KB Coordinator before beginning your service.
- 3 After you have received approval, start completing your service, filling out the 'Practical Service Diary' (available on hub14) as you go.
- 4 Submit your Practical Service Diary to the KB Coordinator before the third Saturday in July at 11:59pm. Before you submit it is a good idea to get your captain (or another experienced officer) to read through your diary.
Before you submit, make sure that your diary meets the required 2,000 words (excluding appendices and supporting documentation)

Assessment Criteria

You will be assessed on the following:

1. Clear understanding of the mission, purpose and people involved in the service organisation
2. Clear and concise Service Log Detailed for hours of service
3. Demonstration of the impact of the service on Boy
4. Presentation and clear expression of ideas
5. Service Log
